CHRISTMAS IN PRAGUE

Advent and Christmas spirit is here. It is a particularly magical time, especially when you find yourself in the historic downtown of Prague where the sound of traditional carols mixes with numerous traditions. The magic of Christmastime takes away the everyday stress. Prague's Christmas markets, especially in the Old Town Square are some of the best loved in Europe. Every year you can buy traditional Czech decorations and sample yuletide goodies. Many other things with a Christmas theme are available. Visits to numerous classic and sometimes exotic nativity scenes

are an interesting experience. Such nativity scenes have a long tradition and are placed all around the country. One of the best known Nativities in Prague is a Baroque creation which is displayed every year in a Church next to the Loretto Chapel in the Hradčany district. More unusual nativity scenes can be seen at the Charles Bridge Museum. One of the main features is a big aquarium containing live carp, which is meant to recreate the bottom of the Vltava (Moldau) river. Around the aquarium you'll see the scene of the Nativity featuring life-size lime wood figures. It is so interesting that all the Czech atheists would say: "We rejoice and hope that Santa Claus will never replace the beautiful Christmas tradition of Baby Jesus." They have even an anti-santa web site. Nativity scenes are everywhere. On the other hand, we have seen only one Santa in the streets of Prague with a bottle of Coke...

THE EXPRESIDENT OF CZECH REPUBLIC HAS DIED

A week before Christmas the former Czech President Václav Havel died at age 75. Thousands of Czechs have lined the streets of Prague to watch the coffin of the late dissident and President Václav Havel being taken to Prague castle. A full state funeral, the first in the history of the Czech Republic, is expected to be held on Friday, December the 23^{rd} in Prague's St Vitus Cathedral. Bill and Hillary Clinton, Madeleine Albright, David Cameron, and other world dignitaries are expected to pay last tribute to Václav Havel. We received the following question:

I remember reading in your e-mails a request about Pastor Daniel. He had been ill and recovered and was able to continue his preaching ministry. I don't remember you mentioning anything further about him. I hope he is doing well. Thanks for your attention. Richard Hyde

This is a big omission on our side. Daniel is doing so well. In his own words he feels much better than before his illness. He is back in full time ministry and the whole experience made him a better servant than ever. We have another man, named Bohuslav Thal, who is currently in our prayers. Several months ago doctors found a tumor on his kidney — it was very aggressive and a progressive kind of cancer. Through God's leading he had surgery almost immediately after diagnosis (at first it looked like he would have to wait for about two months before they would be able to schedule his surgery). We held a 24-hour payer chain for him and our Lord intervened. They removed one kidney and he came out of surgery in good shape. Recently, he had an achy throat and doctors found more cancerous tissues in his tonsils and throat. It was a rather involved and complicated surgery with the expectation of a long recovery to restore functions of swallowing, etc. Once again, his recovery is progressing better than expected. In two weeks he is scheduled to have radiation.

Another young man in our sister church was diagnosed with leukemia. It looks like we have a need for full time intense prayers in our congregation.

Our hearts were saddened when we got word that the founder of Czech broadcasting, Georgina – born of Czech parents in Ecuador, now living in Austin, TX, has been diagnosed with Squamous cell carcinoma. She had surgery at MD Anderson hospital in Houston on Monday, Dec. 5, 2011. Spiritually, Georgina has always been a woman of faith in God. This trial has not diminished her faith. To the contrary, it is stronger than ever. Emotionally she is beginning to accept the changes in the physical appearance. There are changes, such as the swelling to the face that will go away in the short term, but there are also permanent changes with regards to her hairline that will be completely different since the skin grafting will never grow hair in those areas. Physically, her mobility has continued to increase in spite of the hurt and nuisance in her left leg from the grafting area. Her appetite is returning to normal, which is ideal to combat the nausea from the medicines. Georgina and her family are very close to our heart. We appreciate any prayers on behalf of those friends we mentioned and we Praise the Lord for the great outcome in Daniel's life.

- For His protection and good health He blessed us with.
- For opening new opportunities through cooperation with our young and energetic team. Now even their teen children are helping.
