Dear Friends and Partners of the HCJB Global Ministry to the Peoples in Czech and Slovak Republic

Until the end of January we had no snow in Prague. Temperatures were very pleasant for the time of the year. Snow falls were only in the mountains. However, winter started in February. There is so much snow on the ground that road maintenance people do not have space to dispose of it. Winter finally arrived and our weekend travels during freezing February started as a real challenge to say the least. The first travel started Friday the 10th. Pavel was to record some programs at the Trans World Radio (TWR) studio in Brno. About 20 miles from home, and an hour later we made a U-turn heading to Toyota service. Roads were salted and messy. Our windshield wiper liquid got frozen. We had to stop each mile and clear the windshield. After getting new "arctic" wiper liquid and "arctic" diesel we were on the road again.

We attended a wedding Saturday. The bride was born in 1991. Her name is Esther. She is a daughter of Child Evangelism parents. This was truly a gathering of youngsters. Pavel's message to them and the newlyweds was received very well with applause. On Sunday we drove to Zlin where Pavel preached. Overnight temperatures were extremely low, around minus 8 F. We prayed that our car would start, and it did. On this trip we met some people we ministered to some 20 years ago while they still lived in America. That really warmed our hearts.

We have two more weekend outings like this for the month of February. Let us tell you about the latest events we prayed about together.

OUR CONFERENCE IN BRNO (Januray 21st)

We prayed that this would be a highlight of our ministry to Czech and Slovak people and it was. THANK YOU FOR PRAYING.

We drove to the TWR office in Brno Friday morning. It snowed. We made a one hour interview recording, had a nice lunch with all present and spent prayer time together. The same afternoon our team gathered together to set up for the conference. We had close to 200 registered people from the furthest East to the furthest West parts of former Czechoslovakia and places everywhere in between. Pavel is rightmost in the following picture:



In the morning we were ready as people started to arrive. Each person got a Conference packet with "Christ in Exodus" by Stan K. Evers, conference topics, the magazine Battle for the Soul, a book catalogue of Pilgrims Progress Publisher, a pen with our logo, a snack and a bottle of water. The book "Christ in Exodus" was mailed to a number of local pastors as our gift to them with the invitation for our 2013 conference.

Our hearts were touched by reunions with those who listened to our broadcasting from Quito. They showed us our prayer card photo taken in Quito (22 years ago). The biggest surprise of the conference was that we could welcome four generations, and so many new people we had never met before.

We had six conference speakers, one US missionary, one Slovak pastor and four of our coworkers. They did an awesome job and were greatly appreciated. All audio recordings are available on our web pages and this will greatly multiply the number of those who will hear.
