Clayton and Joy were involved with student ministries and our son Filip spent holiday times with their family while we lived in Indonesia. Later on we met with Clayton and Joy in Prague. Clayton had two years assignment in Prague and we became good friends and met some of their friends while they visited them in Prague. Through them we were introduced to Pastor Steve Cole of Flagstaff, AZ, and his wife Marla. Since 2000 we are privileged to translate and broadcast Steve's Sunday messages into Czech and Slovak languages. The same way we met "Uncle Bob" and his wife Carol. They became later our faithful supporters.

- August 12th 1964 we met and in April 17th 1965 we got married.
- August 21st 1968 Russia invaded Czechoslovakia.
- August 11th 1969 we left occupied homeland and became refugees. The United States accepted us as stateless in January 15th 1970.

SUPRISING EVENTS

Last year we mentioned our reunion with "octageraniums" Bill and Harriet Bathman in Arizona. They were in the mission field for 60 years serving in Europe and South Africa. To our surprise they pulled out a shoe box of organized slides from their time of smuggling Bibles and Christian literature to Czechoslovakia. They were there during the Russian occupation in 1968. We were not only amazed but also deeply touched. What a treasure of historical value. The pictures were digitized and ready to be shown. This year during the 45th anniversary of Russian invasion Pavel sent a few pictures from the Bathman's archive to Czech TV. The next day news report team was at our place, and the following day the TV contacted Bill via Skype. The short report appeared in prime time on Czech TV. One of our summer visitors was Christie. She is a lovely "kind-of-blond" young lady from Simi Valley, CA. As she was enjoying Prague, she noticed that people are staring at her. She asked us what's going on. Is it common or does she looks so different? We had no clue until Klara went to town and noticed posters for a new movie with a best known Czech movie star. Christie looked so much like her. No wonder that people noticed and she got so much attention.

Prague celebrated another week long Gay Pride Day Parade event. The U.S. Embassy was one of the main sponsors. Its building was decorated in rainbow colors. The U.S. Ambassador marched in the parade:



This does not make the U.S. more popular among Christians.
