PAVEL'S MINING UNIVERSITY REUNION AFTER 52 YEARS



Pavel's reunion at the Mining University in Ostrava 52 years after graduation was another exciting event. We enjoyed time being together and sharing memories, but our hearts are broken. Out of 21 classmates present, there is no one who is interested in anything spiritual. Ostrava used to be called "Black Ostrava" or "Steel Heart" of Czechoslovakia. The mining and metallurgical industries were closed down in 1994, a few years after the Velvet Revolution. Remnants of the former coal-mining, coke production and ironworks complex are now opened to tourists. The area became a major cultural site of historic industrial architecture in Europe. Visitors can see the whole process of ironworking ironworks. The capacity of blast furnaces and smelting tanks is gigantic. The working conditions and heat during the process were nothing short of hellish. The highlight is the 60 meters tall Bolt Tower at the top, named after Jamaican sprinter Usain Bolt, the fastest human being so far.

A gigantic former gasholder was turned into the multifunctional hall called "the Gong". With a capacity of 1500, it is a unique place for numerous cultural events and conferences. An interactive World of Technology and Science is a popular attraction for children and students.

THE MIND OF A PROCLAIMED ATHEIST

Recently our country mourned the death of popular singer, Karel Gott, known as the "golden voice of Prague" and "Sinatra of the East". Flags flew at half-mast and the Czech leaders were ready to orchestrate a state funeral for him with all honors, if the family agreed. During the national day of mourning, tens of thousands lined up for hours to pay a last tribute and say a final goodbye. The whole atmosphere was reminiscent of the national mourning for the death of Princess Dianna. Flowers and candles covered the street for days at the place where he lived. A Catholic Funeral mass was held at St. Vitus cathedral for invited guests, including the President and Premier. Tributes, prayers, recognitions, awards and 60 years of fame - all his earthly accomplishments - were presented as merit for eternal bliss somewhere "above". Biblically speaking, the prayers of the clergymen during the service were nothing short of blasphemy. A number of atheistic speakers and well-wishers were sending him to heaven to join other stars, i.e. famous and talented personas. As one of the sane commentators pointed out: "If people do not have in their hearts real God they create in their mind god [like a singer] to project their imaginative faith in eternity."

IN HIS TIME

It is amazing how the Lord works. Our radio ministry with HCJB started in 1990 in Ecuador. The Czech and Slovak broadcasting from Voice of the Andes goes back to 1975. Georgina Gonzales and her mother, Lili Kladensky, were the founders. For the next 25 years, Good News from Ecuador provided short wave broadcasting to communist Czechoslovakia. Lili faithfully corresponded with listeners in communist Czechoslovakia. The tandem of daughter and mother had the greatest impact on our lives and ministry.

The family history is very interesting. Lili was of Jewish descent and, as a young girl, survived the Terezin concentration camp. After her return, she married, and at the time when the communists took over, the family immigrated to Ecuador. Because of their emigration from Czechoslovakia, their property in Brno was confiscated.

After the fall of communism in 1989, forty years later, the family was eligible to start the restitution process. To live in Ecuador, USA and Costa Rica and to be involved in courts was quite frustrating. Lili is now 94 years old. Finally, after thirty years the final verdict was issued. The state kept the villa and the family got back all the land. The appraised price of the land became much greater than what it would have been for whole property years back. Praise the Lord for all the delays.

And we know that to them that love God all things work together for good, even to them that are called according to his purpose (Rom. 8:28).

We were happy to help Georgina and her husband with some logistics to close this chapter of the family story.

The new project comes out of all this. The Czech family life story and radio ministry from Ecuador were written in Spanish. Now the time has come to translate and publish it in the Czech language. We will work on it when we stop in Austin.
