It does not mean that our ranks are diminishing; actually number of retired people is growing rapidly especially in Europe. Our generation is now listening to new generation as they are assuming their positions. This is exiting for the future of Czech ministries. Recently we attended lecture - topic Creation vs. Evolution. Libor is the new kid on the block. He is working on research project at the university and teaching at the college level. He came to us about a year ago. It was pleasure to have him in our Bible study group. His ability to express complex thoughts the way people can understand is true gift. We could provide lot of scholarly literature, encourage him to start serving and he is doing great job.

Their hearts are on fire to bring change especially to local church's attitude toward evangelization leading to the growth by adding new believers.

Jerry Marek, a Czech Canadian, wrote a manual addressing the Church growth. Klara is translating his text from "engliczech" into proper Czech language. Inverse work is for us doing Nathan Dell who modifies our "czenglish" into proper English. What a timing – our church started to look into assessment of our ministry services reserves and ways how to develop outreach to the visitors and how to serve better those who might need help. Church fellowship is usually limited to small groups of somehow related people (related families, past church or denomination memberships. age groups - children, teens, common interests – sports,...). Anonymity of people is one of the most disturbing facts. Attempts to create general or specific Church directory was previously always rejected. We know each other by the faces only and even after several years of the church attendance we do not know each other by the name.

I benefit from your magazine a lot. I only regret that you do not anymore analyze readers' letters in your column "You Wrote to Us". Your Biblical investigation of readers' disagreements and doubtfulness was always very instructive. Your explanations, though often iterative, surely serve those who didn't write to you their views either from hesitation or diffidence (Philippians 3:1). I mind a little that you quote in your articles theologians that are less known at least to me unless, you quote well known names such as Spurgeon, Stott, Wesley, Barth etc. Their nationality or denomination would help at least. However, these are just small technicalities. I join those who like and enjoy your magazine and appreciate your effort. I neither own Internet nor am able to dial on my tuner "Radio7" nor your latest programs. Thus, your magazine is for me the only connection with you. I believe that there are many older people who are in the same situation as me.

I often think over the words of our Lord Jesus Christ when He says:

 "Not everyone who says to Me, `Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter. "Many will say to Me on that day, `Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' "And then I will declare to them, `I never knew you; DEPART FROM ME, YOU WHO PRACTICE LAWLESSNESS.' (Matthew 7:21-23)

Whom are these Jesus' words addressed to, and why Jesus refused those who proclaimed allegiance to Him? What did they do wrong? What was their error? Why did He reject them so uncompromisingly?

Søren Kierkegaard in his book "Preparation for a Christian Life" (1848) describes differences between a follower of Christ and admirer of Christ. In essence he says:

Christ came to the world with intention to save the world and concurrently become an example. He also left His footprint for those who will join and follow Him. These are the followers of Christ whose footprint matches the Christ's footprint. Christ is thus the example. To become an example He had to be born and lived in trepidation and humiliation.

Christ could not offer more than His own conditions to those who join Him. No admirer of Christ can ever join Him under Christ's conditions. Therefore, no admirer of Christ ever became His follower.

What is then the difference between an admirer and follower? The follower wishes to be like the one whom he admires. However, mere admirer personally dwells outside demands of the one he admires, and either knowingly or unknowingly pays no attention to the fact that the admired one exhorts him to either become or strive to be like the one whom he admires.

Admiring Christ instead of following Him is untruth and delusion that is quite common in Christendom of any historical epoch. Admiration derogates Christ's demands to mere adoration.

With this on my mind I end my reflection. Let God bless and accompany you on your way following Christ.
