PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION IN CZECH REPUBLIC

Vaclav Klaus, the leaving president, in his final New Year's speech announced wide amnesty to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the "Velvet Divorce" when Czechoslovakia split into two present-day countries. About 1/3 of all prisoners were released within a few days. The amnesty included some of the fraud and corruption cases that originated from lax regulation of banks and the capital market under Klaus's government in the 1990s. Most of the people are in disbelief about this decision: The Prague Post, January 9, 2013 penned: "We consider it scandalous that the amnesty will set free the protagonists of big financial crimes, including the siphoning off of banks' and firms' assets, fraud during privatizations and tax evasion worth billions of crowns."

The January presidential pre-election atmosphere is tense. Out of nine candidates the most likely choices are between two former communists and hopefully one aristocrat. Another respectable candidate looks like Avatar since his whole body and especially his face and head are tattooed like New Zealand's Mao-Among the candidates we had ri warriors. three ladies. Their outcome was really poor. Several of the candidates have dual citizenship and six out of nine family names are of German origin. The first round left two candidates. One communist whose name is Zeman that translates to mean Squire, and the other whose name is Schwartzenberg, and he is a real Duke. Now we are expecting the clash of two Titans in the second and final election round. This time it should not be about right and left but about values. What is amazing is that many young people support the 75 year old Duke.

Two quotes of Franz Kafka (1883-1924) who describes unpredictable events quite well: "*Every revolution evaporates and leaves behind only the slime of a new bureaucracy.*" Or: "*It is often safer to be in chains than to be free.*" We shall see which quote will be more accurate. Kafka was born into a middle-class, German-speaking Jewish family in Prague. He was the most influential existentialist. The term *Kafkaesque* has entered the English language to describe surreal situations reminiscent of his writings.

DECISIONS

In January it has been 10 years since we started Slovak broadcasting. For 10 years we were charged the same price for air time. Milan is currently negotiating the cost of a contract extension with Radio Lumen. In the meantime he is working on Internet Radio Logos (the domain is already registered). His goal is to be ready with the start-up project by May/June. Financially it looks like Internet broadcasting will be about the same cost as buying broadcasting time now. We know that all is in His hands. At this time we can only expect this new door to be opened. We continue translating and producing radio programs and the broadcasting format without interruption. Let us share a November note from Milan, Slovakia:

We knew that one of the broadcasting hardware parts "burned out beyond repair." We were happy to help to replace it. Also Milan will have the broadcasting help of two seminary graduates. Radio programs that Milan and his team prepare are broadcasted also in Serbia to the Slovak minority living there. What more can we ask for? Our prayer is that our Lord will give sufficient strength and endurance to all involved.

PAVEL'S LETTER TO JOHN MacARTHUR CONCERNING HIS BOOK "SLAVE"

Dear John,

This is Pavel Steiger. My wife Klara and I enjoyed very much your presentation in Lage, Germany. It was nice to see you and shake hands after about ten years. When we met the first time in L.A., I was 37. Now I am 70...

Your topic was "Slave." Let me expound a bit more on the etymology of the word *slave*.

Slavs are peoples. The western Slavs are Poles, Czechs and Slovaks. The eastern Slavs are Russians, Ukrainians and Byelorussians. The southern Slavs are Serbs, Croats, Slovenes and Bulgarians. Those under Rome were Catholics and use the Latin alphabet *(Poles, Czechs, Slovaks Croats and Slovenes)*. Those under Constantinople were Orthodox and use a modified Greek alphabet—Cyrillic *(Russians, Ukrainians, Byelorussians, Serbs and Bulgarians)*.

In all Slavic languages the word for *word* is *slovo*. Since all these peoples could to a certain degree communicate among themselves using *word—slovo*, they called themselves *Slo-vane—Slavs*. On the other hand, Slavs could not exchange *word—slovo* with Germanic tribes to the west, hence all Slavic peoples call Germans to this very day *Nemici* that is derived from Slavic word *nemi* that simply means *word-less, tongueless, dumb, mute, voiceless…* The following link confirms it:

Otto the Great (912-973) Holy Roman Emperor consolidated Germany, maneuvered Pope John XII into crowning him Emperor and later deposed him and set Pope Leo VIII in his place. Such a consolidation took a lot of fighting by Otto and his successors. The empire expanded eastward. Many resisting, fighting Slavs were taken into captivity and consequently sold for forced labor. Thus the word *sklave—slave*, came into existence.

SLAVE (n.): late 13c., "person who is the property of another," from O.Fr. esclave (13c.), from M.L. Sclavus "slave" (cf. It. schiavo, Fr. esclave, Sp. esclavo), originally "Slav" (see Slav), so called because of the many Slavs sold into slavery by conquering peoples.

This sense development arose in the consequence of the wars waged by Otto the Great and his successors against the Slavs, a great number of whom they took captive and sold into slavery. [Klein] The following link confirms it:

So, the word *slave* is, unintentionally, according to present thinking very politically incorrect term. It is derived from the name of an ethnic group of peoples. When we lived Stateside I was always joking that I would sue the English language for using words such as *slave or slavish*.

One last very interesting remark: For Slavic ears, in opposition to western Germanic or Latin ears, the word *slovo* that looks and sounds similar to *slave* is probably the highest one. Many other noble words are derived from it. For example, *fame*, *glory stardom etc.* is *slava*. Famous or glorious is he, about whom, are spoken *words–slova*. Many popular Slavic names have ending *-slav*. Jaro*slav* glorifies spring, Miro*slav* glorifies peace, Bohu*slav* glorifies God etc. The English name of King Wence*slaus* who was actually Duke of Bohemia (921-935), in today's Czech Vaclav, formerly Vece*slav* simply means *more glorious*.

A Slavic Bible-knowing Christian who understands the etymology of the English word *slave*, German *sklave* or French *esclave* etc. has a very strange acoustical and visual association when reading for example John 1:1 in his own Slavic language:

In the beginning was the Word (SLOVO), and the Word (SLOVO) was with God, and the Word (SLOVO) was God.

This is all. I hope I did not occupy too much of your time. Thanks for your teaching.

In His Sovereign Grace Yours pavel Steiger P.S.: Slavic languages use for *slave* words *otrok, rob, rab.* Forced labor in Czech is *robota.* Hence, a Czech writer Karel Čapek, rather his brother Josef, coined the word *robot.* Read this interesting story, just click:
