### **RETURNS AND RETREATS**

### The two of us went separate ways.

Pavel, Jarda and Jan drove to our beloved Northern Moravia territory where we have ministered many times in the past. The topic of the conference was "Bible Under Flak". Pavel met with so many dear friends from the past and we are happy to report that our team was received with great joy and love. We are proud that our generation of servants raised new servants who continue where we all labored together. Yes, there are spiritual children and grandchildren. The Lord is faithful and blesses this Godly part of the country.

Klara attended the first Ladies retreat in our church (in 12 years). It was organized by young mothers and they did an outstanding job. Most important was that it was a multigenerational event.

During the opening evening our Pastor Daniel took us again back to the Moravian Brethren era. We watched a documentary about the history and beginnings of the mission. Of particular interest was the segment about church leaders' wives. The mission outreach of the Moravian brethren can be an inspiration to any mission organization and individuals. Their motto: "In Nonessentials, Liberty; In All Things, Love."

The Protestant group known as Moravians originated in the 15<sup>th</sup> century in Bohemia and Moravia (both in present-day Czech Republic) as the Unitas Fratrum, which means "Unity of Brethren." Members of the Unitas Fratrum followed the teachings of the Bohemian reformer, Jan Hus (John Huss). They took the name "Moravians" in the early 18<sup>th</sup> century as a reference to the group's place of origin. The Moravians were some of the earliest Protestants, rebelling against the authority of Rome some fifty years before <u>Martin</u> <u>Luther</u>.

One unusual and (for its time) shocking belief was the group's eventual focus on universal education. By the middle of the 16<sup>th</sup> century as many as 90% of the inhabitants of the Czech lands were Protestant. The majority of nobility was Protestant, the schools and printing-shops established by the Moravian Church were flourishing. Very often the Brethren were protected by local nobles who joined their ranks to assert their independence from <u>Habsburg</u> Vienna. By the middle of the 16<sup>th</sup> century there was not a single town without a Protestant school in the Czech lands, and many had more than one, mostly with two to six teachers each.

Moravians were among the many religious groups that migrated to colonial America in search of social and economic opportunity and the chance to spread their religious beliefs.

On Christmas Eve in 1741, David Nitschmann and Count Nicolaus von Zinzendorf. leading a small group of Moravians, founded the mission community of Bethlehem along the banks of the Monocacy Creek by the Lehigh River in the colony of Pennsylvania. They named the settlement after the town of Bethlehem in Judea, the birthplace of Jesus. The colony was known for its rich natural resources and its extraordinary tolerance of religious ideas. Pennsylvania became host to a heterogeneous population of many ethnic groups who spoke different languages and had different social and religious practices. By the 1750's, several hundred Moravians lived in Bethlehem. Members of the Moravian community purchased a 500 acre tract of land north of Philadelphia in 1741. There, along the Lehigh River, they organized and built the communal society of Bethlehem, which became the base location for all Moravian missionary activity in North America. Eventually they established 32 mission towns among them Nazareth, Lititz, Lebanon, Hope and Emaus. Bethlehem, however, remained the seat of the Moravian community as well as the industrial center.

The American Moravian Church sponsors <u>Moravian College</u> and Seminary, recognized as the sixth-oldest institution of higher education in the United States. (Gathered from different web pages resources)

The first month of broadcasting we had 1500 visits. In the last two weeks of broadcasting:

- 4. Canada, 15 listeners, 900 minutes

Milan created an application for cell phone listening; broadcasting can also be listened to over portable internet radio. He is implementing all modern technical avenues to bring Good News to as many homes as possible. He is a great encouragement and example of a faithful servant to all of us. We continue to translate messages from Pastor Steve Cole from Flagstaff, AZ. It is a joy and privilege to be part of His team.

## **OPENING AND CLOSING DOORS**

Many of faithful friends and supporters of HCJB Global visited ministries in Ecuador in the past. Actually that was the time we first met many of you, our prayer partners and faithful supporters. Our memories are unforgettable however, times and opportunities are changing.

Each time when we meet with you we are asked about the situation in Quito. This is the latest communication we have. Our dear friends and pillars of HCJB Global, Darlene and Doug Peters, described the situation after an earlier official announcement as follows:

For more than six decades HCJB Global has been involved with healthcare in Quito, Ecuador's capital. The mission operated a small "Indian clinic" beginning in 1950 with the clinic leading to the founding of Hospital Vozandes Quito (HVQ) in 1955. In recent years the medical landscape in Quito has radically changed. Quality healthcare is now accessible to more and more of Quito's two million residents. At the same time, it has been increasingly difficult to operate a hospital amid the current and upcoming regulations/legal issues. After prayerful consideration, our board of trustees has decided now is the time to begin searching for a new owner to run HVQ. This is a strategic ministry decision that will enable us to touch more lives around the world. After the sale, any remaining proceeds will help expand our healthcare ministries by establishing mobile clinics, training medical workers, installing clean water wells and teaching hygiene. We are encouraged as we see the many opportunities the Lord is giving HCJB Global as we serve with global partners as the Voice and Hands of Jesus. Pray for mission leadership in the Latin America Region as they seek a potential buyer. Pray that God would bring Christ-centered owners to lead HVQ into the future.

Praise God for the lives that have been physically helped and spiritually changed because of the ministry of HVQ. Praise God for the donors and staff of Hospital Vozandes Quito HVQ over the the past six decades.
