SOME CZECH CONTRIBUTION TO THE WORLD

Sugar Cube

Sugar cubes are food sugar processed into a cube. Until the middle of the 19th century, sugar was distributed mainly in the form of sugar-loaves. Jakub Kryštof Rad is considered to be the inventor of sugar cubes. He was the director of the Dačice refinery and patented sugar cubes in 1843. The privilege of producing sugar cubes was granted to Rad on January 23, 1843.

Juliana Radová, Rad's wife, injured her finger while trying to chip off a piece of sugar from a sugar-loaf. The sugar-loaves were hard and impractical, up to five feet high. Anyone needing sugar could not do without a hammer, pliers, or crowbar. The woman suggested to her husband, Jakub Kryštof Rad, the refinery director and an enthusiastic inventor, that he should come up with an easier way.

Rad's first cubes were in the shape of a cuboid with edge dimensions of 1/2 by 5/8 of an inch. Later, they began to differ from one manufacturer to another, and the shape also changed from a cube to various geometric shapes, such as the characters of the bridge card colors – clubs, diamonds, hearts, and spades.

Propeller

Josef Ressel, a Czech-born inventor, was ahead of his time. Although he invented many different devices, he is mainly famous for being the first to invent and use the propeller.

The ball-bearing without oiling, press-roller for oil and wine, rolling mill, and steam engine with air cooling were just a few inventions introduced by the Czech inventor Josef Ressel. Ressel was born in the east Bohemian town of Chrudim in 1793. He studied at an artillery school in Česke Budějovice (Budweis) where he acquired outstanding knowledge of mathematics, geometry, and technical drawing.

At the Vienna University, Ressel attended lectures on forestry, chemistry, technology, and natural sciences. But due to a lack of money, he had to leave the university and became a forester after graduating from a forestry school. At his new job, he came up with many gimmicks, for instance how to measure areas of woods quickly and reliably. The job instigated an interest in sea navigation in the young man, as his duty was to care for wood from deforesting to the building of sea ships. So among many other inventions, Ressel became famous for the propeller. In 1826 he applied for an Austrian patent for what he called "a never-ending screw which can be used to drive ships both on sea and rivers" and he received the license in February 1827.

Ressel was the first to place the propeller between the helm and the stern so that the propeller worked under the water thus being most efficient.

But Ressel's authorship of the invention was put in doubt due to inertia of the Austrian Presidium of Imperial Sciences when in a suspicious coincidence, English traders Sauvage and Smith came up with the same invention. It is believed now that someone might have secretly sold Ressel's invention to Great Britain. But in 1865, at its arbitrary session, the National Academy in Washington decided the matter in Ressel's favor. Ressel died of malaria in 1857 in Ljubljana, Slovenia, where he's buried.
